You will be responsible for preparing and giving lessons in Brass (any specialism considered but a willingness to teach more than one Brass instrument is essential) to pupils in our Primary and Secondary Schools (including 6th form) in line with the agreed timetable, and in preparation for ABRSM examinations. We are seeking a casual working arrangement whereby the hours of work will be flexible based on pupil interest.
